

From the East



“There are two ways of spreading light:
to be the candle or the mirror that reflects it.”

Edith Wharton

There are a lot of ways to look at that quote. We're all both candles and mirrors at different points in time on different issues and in different situations.

It's a good thing. When we're capable of creating paths (whether we really want to walk them or we feel compelled to walk them for the greater good), of doing things that need doing (pleasant or not), or we take action to make situations better, we're the candle.

When we are the candle, we emit light into shadows and darkness and others see it and find their way or reflect it, emulating us, like mirrors. When your children mimic your actions. If you ask them for something and always say thank you, then they automatically do, too. When you treat others with respect, conduct yourself with dignity and grace, then others are more apt to treat you that way, as well. Not certain to, but more apt to. With free will, that's the best you can do: be responsible for yourself.

When you're the candle, you choose what light you cast. Knowing others reflect it, you should aspire to have it be the best you have to give.

If it is positive and constructive and helpful—either inflicted directly or condoned—then you reflect it.

When you're the mirror—and at times we all are—then you don't choose good or bad, right or wrong, negative or positive, or destructive or constructive. You simply reflect.

My brother, which are you? The candle or the mirror?

As the candle, try to shine only the good and as the mirror, reflect all good and try to resist reflecting the bad.

Constitution and Laws

**TITLE FOUR: GRAND LODGE BY-LAWS
ARTICLE IX. MEMBERSHIP**

Section 8. Suspension and Restoration of Membership Rights.

Part 1. ***Suspension for Non-Payment of Dues.***

- (a) *Grounds for Suspension.* Any member of the lodges within the jurisdiction of this Grand Lodge who shall be in arrears for dues twelve months, and who shall refuse or neglect to pay the same within three months after demand thereof shall have been made by the Secretary of the lodge to which the same are due and payable,

may be suspended, after due and timely notice of a regular communication of the lodge at which he may be heard in regard to his proposed suspension.

[Gen. Reg. Paragraph 14 above, repeated here for references purposes]

- (b) *Returned Mail Notice is Effective.* Members of lodges more than twelve months in arrears for dues, upon whom written demand for payment has been made by the Secretary, by notice, mailed to their last known places of residence, may be suspended in accordance with the requirements of the Fourteenth and Seventeenth General Regulations, notwithstanding the notice be returned as undelivered letter.
- (c) *Form of Notice.* A notice in the following form: "Brother ..., your dues to ... are \$... " when accompanied by a copy of the Fourteenth General Regulation, is a sufficient demand to authorize actions upon the suspension of a brother for the non-payment of dues.
- (d) *Trial Not Required.* A trial is not necessary to authorize suspension for non-payment of dues.
- (e) *Payment Before Ballot.* A brother may not be suspended for non-payment of dues if prior to the date specified for action by the lodge in accordance with the Fourteenth General Regulation, he pay such arrearage. Dues which have accumulated against the brother since the issuance of said notice or demand is a matter for subsequent consideration, and requires a new notice issued.
- (f) *Tender of Payment.* When a brother suspended for non-payment of dues tenders to the Secretary the amount of his indebtedness, the money should be received and a receipt given for the same. It would not be proper for the Master to order the money returned in case the lodge refused to reinstate the brother.
- (g) *No Action at Emergent Communications.* It is unlawful to suspend a member for non-payment of dues at an emergent communication.
- (h) *Labor.* Balloting on Suspension for nonpayment of dues must be held on the Master Mason Degree.
- (i) *Prohibition from Attending Lodges During Suspension.* A brother,

while suspended for non-payment of dues, cannot visit any lodge.

- (j) *Restoration from Suspension N.P.D. for Dual Members.* Where the loss of membership (by a dual member) is for non-payment of dues, restoration in the lodge suspending shall act as a restoration in the other lodge.
- (k) *Restoration from Suspension N.P.D. for Longer than Five Years.* A request for restoration of a brother who has been under suspension for more than five years for non-payment of dues shall be processed in like manner as a petition for membership, but no fee shall be required for such suspension.

Part 2. ***Ballots For Suspension/Restoration.***

- (a) *Suspension.* For the suspension from membership of a member, either of the Grand Lodge or of a lodge, two-thirds of the votes of the members present shall be required, by ballot. Suspension of a member takes effect immediately upon the announcement of the requisite vote, without reference to approval of the minutes.

[Gen. Reg. Paragraph 17 above in part, repeated here for reference purposes]

- (b) *Restoration.* For the restoration to membership of a member, either of the Grand Lodge or of a lodge, a unanimous vote of the members present shall be required, by ballot, provided that in cases where the nonpayment of dues shall have been the sole cause of suspension and application for restoration to membership is made within five years from the date of suspension, a majority vote, by ballot, of the members present shall be sufficient to restore, and in cases where the member shall have been in suspension for five years, or more, for nonpayment of dues, a unanimous vote, by ballot, shall be required for restoration to membership.

[Gen. Reg. Paragraph 17 above in part, repeated here for references purposes]

Part 3. ***Effect of Suspension; Jurisdiction of Lodge.*** Suspension does not relieve the suspended brother from his Masonic obligations, nor does it deprive his lodge of jurisdiction over him.

Part 4. ***Publication Prohibited.*** It is improper to print the names of suspended or expelled Masons in circulars issued by lodges.

Part 5. ***Suspension for Definite Periods.*** Definite suspension expires by its limitations, and expiration restores the suspended brother to all rights and privileges held before suspension, without action by the lodge.

Part 6. ***Irregular Suspensions.*** A brother irregularly suspended cannot be reinstated, but the Grand Lodge or the Grand Master may, when appealed to, declare such suspension inoperative.

Part 7. ***Suspension of Dual Members.***

- (a) *Suspension Effective Globally.* Involuntary loss of membership in one lodge (by a dual member) shall constitute loss of membership in both lodges.
- (b) *Notification by Grand Secretary; Membership in Foreign Jurisdictions.* In case of suspension or involuntary loss of membership (by a dual member) where both lodges are in this Grand Jurisdiction, the Grand Secretary shall forthwith notify the other lodge. Where the other lodge is outside this Grand Jurisdiction, the Grand Secretary shall forthwith notify the Grand Secretary of that Grand Jurisdiction.
- (c) *Restoration Only Effective in Suspending Lodge.* After involuntary loss of membership, except where said loss is for non-payment of dues, restoration to membership of a former dual member shall be effective only in the lodge which takes such action.

Part 8. ***Partial Immunity from Suspension.***

- (a) *Elected Lodge Officers.* An elected officer of a lodge may be suspended from office only by the Grand Lodge or the Grand Master.
- (b) *Grand Lodge Officer.* An officer of the Grand Lodge cannot be suspended by a lodge during his term of office.

Part 9. ***Restoration Generally.***

- (a) *Application to Secretary.* A suspended Mason must apply in writing through the Secretary for reinstatement. Such application, except in cases of suspension for non-payment of dues, shall lie over until the next regular communication, and due notice be given to the mem-

bers of the lodge.

- (b) *Committee of Investigation.* On receipt of an application for restoration to membership from an indefinite suspension for unma-sonic conduct, a committee should be appointed to report to the lodge (before its action on the same), upon the conduct of the petitioner during his suspension from membership.
- (c) *Multiple Requests.* If two requests for restoration of a suspended Mason are denied within any one year period, no further request for restoration shall be made until the expiration of one year from the date of the last rejection.

Part 10. ***Expelled Members.*** A lodge may not restore an expelled member.

Part 11. ***Notification of Grand Secretary.*** In cases of restoration of brethren to good standing, the Grand Secretary should be at once notified of the fact, with the date of restoration, which should be entered opposite the name of the restored brother on the records of Grand Lodge.

I take this opportunity to request that you review your membership status. Do you possess a 2017 Dues card? If your answer is no and you cannot locate your dues notice, please immediately contact the Junior Warden at (609) 203-3210 or Secretary at (609) 499-0499. As you should be aware changes in the Grand Lodge Constitution and Laws require all Lodges to notify Brothers who are not current with their dues. As Masons, we are individually responsible for our conduct, including notifying our Lodge Secretary of changes in address or contact information. We have always been responsible for paying dues when notified. In August, final notices will be mailed to all Brothers who have not obtained a 2017 Dues card. With heavy hearts, we will place the names of these Brothers on a ballot for suspension, effective December 31, 2017, for Non-Payment of Dues. No Brother in Mount Moriah Lodge #28 seeks this outcome. In fact it is repugnant to our character as Masons.

Your Brothers are interested in your regular attendance and participation in the multitude of activities scheduled throughout the year, including, meetings, degrees, debates, dinners, parades, memorial events, poker night and car shows to name a few. We recognize that times change and with them fortunes. If you are having difficulty, please do not suffer in silence contact your Lodge to discuss your situation.




